Established in 2016, the [Oceans Research in Canada Alliance \(ORCA\)](#) brings together Canada's ocean science and technology community to share knowledge and work collaboratively to increase our understanding of the oceans and to advance ocean technology and innovation.

The ORCA 2023 National Meeting will be held June 1-2, 2023 at the Sheraton Hotel in St. John's, NL, in partnership and on location, with the [Canadian Meteorological and Oceanographic Society \(CMOS\) Congress](#) being held that same week.

Under the theme *'Together, Let's Build a Strong Canadian Contribution to the Ocean Decade'*, ORCA 2023 is an opportunity to showcase the diversity of the Canadian ocean community, providing a platform for sharing information, networking, building on existing collaborations and establishing new partnerships.
